# **Becoming Rich**

Through the working of the Holy Spirit, Christians understand that riches do not consist of money. In fact, riches have nothing to do with money. We can have very little money and be very rich or be very wealthy and be impoverished. True riches have to do with a right relationship with Jesus Who brings us happiness, satisfaction, joy, love, and peace. Material possessions do not constitute real riches.

Material things are transitory. "When your eyes light on it, [wealth] is gone, for suddenly it sprouts wings, flying like an eagle toward heaven" (Proverbs 23:5). What we possess materially is subject to loss in a variety of ways. Our wealth can be lost in the stock market or through rust, obsolescence, and thievery. No matter how much money we may have, we have no way of guaranteeing that it can be kept safe and secure. Money can be lost, stolen, or its purchasing power lost through inflation. Investments can decline in value and businesses can fail. Our property can be burned or robbed. All material things can be gone quickly. Even if our material things stay with us, we will eventually leave them, because, at the end, we can take nothing with us.

Material goods and earthly treasures are deceitful and uncertain. In Jesus explanation of the Parable of the Sower, He said, "As for what was sown among thorns, this is the one who hears the word, but the cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches choke the word, and it proves unfruitful" (Matthew 13:22). In the Apostle Paul's letter to Timothy, he wrote, "As for the rich in this present age, charge them not to be haughty, nor to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, Who richly provides us with everything to enjoy" (1 Timothy 6:17).

So, if we want to be rich, it cannot be on the basis of material things. Things of this world are much too precarious a foundation on which to build a life. With God's help, we can turn away from material things and turn toward Christ. Jesus urges us to "lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven...For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:20-21). As God's people, our riches come from storing up riches in heaven.

Loving God with all of our heart, soul, and strength and our neighbors as ourselves builds up treasures in heaven. As the Holy Spirit leads us to loosen our grip on things of this world, we can learn to be content with what we have rather than always wanting more worldly things.

Through faith, we are rich. As Christians, we receive the riches of eternal life with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

Regular church attendance is good for our physical health and our mental health. In a review of 69 studies, regularly attending church is linked to a lower incidence of death from cardiovascular disease.

Similarly, a Norwegian study published in the International Journal of Psychiatry in Medicine found that the more times a person spends at church, the lower his or her blood pressure. (The Norwegian study strengthened an American study that had already made that conclusion).

Furthermore, Psychology Today reports that regular church attendance also boosts mental health by providing feelings of hope and belonging, as well as increasing self-esteem and sense of self-worth. That makes sense because a\as Christians, we know we are loved: "But God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." Romans 5:8

#### ORGAN FUND UPDATE

We praise God and thank the congregation for its financial outpouring of support for the Organ Fund. The total cost of the upgrade for the organ is \$83,000. The Foundation has agreed to cover the costs initially, with the congregation contributing as much as possible in the form of reimbursement to the Foundation. The total contributions for the Organ Fund reached over \$12,000 at the end of May. The congregation has reimbursed the Foundation for the first \$11,000. The initial installment was \$18,000 to sign the agreement.

The organ company performing the upgrades, has indicated that we are on the list and are currently awaiting parts. They still hope to have the upgrades completed by the end of summer.

While we have reached the first goal of \$10,000, we hope to reimburse the Foundation with a significant amount of the overall cost. We thank those who have continued to contribute and encourage others to do so over the coming months. Offering envelopes will continue to be available on a table in the Narthex (look for the Organ Fund flyer/ display).
